 - "Wikipedia will have the answer"










Sensible research – top tips

- Don't just click the first link!
- Don't believe everything you read, ask:
 - Is this valid?
 - Is there bias?
 - Do other sources back this up?
- We will teach "good research" skills when using the Internet.









- Have a healthy balance of social time:
 - Using computers
 - Going out
 - Doing exercise
 - Doing homework!
- It is important to spend time away from technology.









Social networking

- You should be 13 to have a Facebook, Instagram, Snapchat account.
- We would not expect year 7s to have accounts...
- ...but they probably will.
- They need to be taught online etiquette.







Before sending messages

- THINK...
- T = Is it True? How do you know?
- H = Is it Helpful? Will it resolve a situation?
- I = Is it inspiring? Will it make someone feel better or worse?
- N = Is it necessary? Or is it better said face to face?
- K = Is it kind?







Social networking

- Social networking is the biggest source of bullying amongst young people.
- Don't befriend other students that are not really your friends. "6 true friends" "100's of FB friends".



- Don't be afraid to block, unfriend people who are unkind.
- Friend your child! Report issues.






Parental monitoring

Parental monitoring


- As a parent you should:
