### Attendance: The Top Facts to Know and Share

Improving school attendance is everyone's business and, to tackle the challenge we face, we need to work together. As a school we want to work with parents/carers to ensure that every child's attendance is as high as possible as there is a clear link between attendance, progress and wellbeing.




The link between attendance and attainment is clear. Poor attendance has a dramatic relationship with GCSE results. While 78% of all children who were rarely absent in key stage 4 passed at least 5 GCSEs including English and maths, only 36% of children who were persistently absent in key stage 4 and just 5% of children who were severely absent in key stage 4 reached this same standard.

Attendance is important for more than just attainment. Regular school attendance can facilitate positive peer relationships, which is a protective factor for mental health and wellbeing. The NHS have produced clear guidelines to be used by schools and parents/carers which state when children should be kept off school and when they shouldn't. As a school we will be referring to this guidance to determine if we are able to record absences as authorised or unauthorised. You can find this information using the link below:
